Update on Pump repair

Completed. Applewood Controls, Inc., removed the electronic box, removed and replaced capacitors. Functionality restored.

Request for Comments from Conservation Commission re: 23 Peninsula Road

In 2017 special permits were obtained to renovate, install septic, re-grade, plant, etc. ZBA granted a conditional permit, deferring to, and relying on the Conservation Commission to ensure wetlands protection.

The Conservation Commission issued a series of special conditions which included some permanent conditions regarding stormwater structures, their regular inspection, cleaning, annual written reports, etc. The property is currently in non-compliance with the maintenance, inspection and reporting, and the proposal is in violation of the original order of conditions.

Discuss that the 2020 algal bloom probably in-part attributable to level of development within the watershed. The Pond Committee's position is that protection of the pond and watershed is essential, and one-off exceptions can have an aggregate impact. Bruce Leicher to draft a letter addressing:

- 1) Site Plan activities to accommodate existing live trees; limbing of trees in accordance with Conservation Commission standards.
- 2) Removal of invasive plants is acceptable.
- 3) Compliance with the original Order of Conditions.
- 4) Avoid addition of impervious surface for pathways.

Voted and approved.

Request for Support from Board of Health for Opt-Out From State Mosquito Spraying Program

Request for the Select Board to opt-out of aerial and street spraying for mosquitos. Unless there is a state of emergency (due to EEE or West Nile Virus) the state won't routinely spray. Town has to demonstrate that the DPW does catch-basin treatments. The Pond committee supports the BOH request. Voted and approved.
