Minutes of December 5th were reviewed and approved as amended.

Review/Updates of Capital Plan

- Fire pond repairs are now at \$50,000 per year for five years.
- Stone wall project has been removed. It is not on Town owned land.
- Preservation of Town Records removed. CPC voted last week to fund this.
- The Bromfield School ramp project has been split into two items. FY18 is at \$30,000 for the study/design of the project, and FY19 is at \$120,000 for the construction/repair of the ramp.
- Bromfield House painting was removed from Capital Plan.
- There was discussion regarding the replacement of locks on all school classroom doors for FY18 and FY19. Based on the actual amounts given to the School recently, the numbers are lower than what was submitted. Patty will look into this more, and we will discuss further at next meeting.
