## **Completion of Town Docks**

### **Summary description of the project:**

The town docks are half complete and require manual installation/removal each year by the Harbormaster. One half of the town docks are wooden docks build by BHRA along with some old, "pillow" floats. Both halves are secured in the water with galvanized poles that are screwed in manually by the Harbormaster. This work is difficult, and the water is very cold. This project would buy the 2nd half of dock floats (low for crew & other use) and replace the pole method with an easier method to secure the floats. A dock professional will be hired to do the work. #### How will this project benefit the community?

Improved docks for all town boaters. Safety improvement at the town docks, used by BHRA, kids and adults. Reduced volunteer labor to secure and re-secure the town docks each year. Less damaged due to ice flow.

#### Do you have any other funds available?

The town beach expense budget has \$700 each year to repair/service the docks and moorings. There is not enough to make a major improvement like this. This estimate is based on buying 7 low dock sections @ \$1,500 each, dock hardware for \$500, an anchoring system for both docks @ \$4k and a contract for a dock professional for \$10k.
