Bob opened meeting and detailed our mission statement, where to find the minutes and videos of previous meetings.

Welcomed Dr Martin Feehan - State Deer Biologist

Bob asked Dr. Feehan for his thoughts on the Deer Management Subcommittee's 2021 Season Report. Feehan said the big thing was increase properties and increased the harvest. With just two minor inadvertent incidents (Stand vandalism and camera theft). Harvard deer management is "Rolling in the right direction – now you have a couple successful years - you have it off the ground - you have not had issues – the harvest is growing – the properties are growing – headed in the direction of opening access and continuing what you are doing."

Bob thanked Feehan for his counsel in assisting and advising the DMS regarding the assigned hunter hunt which was a departure from the previous year.

Bob asked DMS members to divide the presentation to the Commission between themselves. Tom to do parcels and conclusions – Bob will discuss game plan – Joe will speak to division of parcels.

Tom asked about Stand sweep. (Taking down stands that were not authorized) Joe stated there is one near Shaker Springs – based on OnX GPS maps it is on ConCom land. Its about 25 yards over the line and "may be displaced". Joe has reached out to the owner of the stand. Owner did not meet with Joe as planned.

Bob: "Dan Tracy, Eve Wittenberg can we help you with anything?" (15:30)

Eve: "No thanks"
Dan: "No thanks."

Joe would like to discuss survey at some point. Bob: We can do that perhaps at our next meeting.

Tom: Monitoring – techniques. Bob: We may want to discuss with other towns what they use.

Feehan: Oak sentinels pilot study this year. We can discuss how we may do it with different

partners like towns and Audubon.

Feehan: Depends on the town's ability to get seedings.

Bob: We can approach Commission for funding.
