Meeting Discussion/Status
1. The minutes of 8/11/21 were approved 4-0 without comment.
<ol> <li>HES Solar 260 kW DC Behind the Meter project –         <ul> <li>NGRID Electric Billing Rate – the project is based on G-3 rate and the bill shows G-1 rate. NGRID agreed to make the change. – pending.</li> <li>Solect Building Permit – approved. Historical Commission investigating jurisdiction of the historic district guidelines despite Select Board ruling.</li> <li>Solect Construction – Installation including racks, panels, wiring expected to be completed by 10/15, Commission by 12/15 and operate in Jan 2022.</li> </ul> </li> </ol>
<ol> <li>Green Community Program         <ol> <li>GC2021 Spring Competitive grant approved award received for the 4 projects below.</li> <li>Bromfield Transformers – high efficiency/re-sizing – Proposed.</li> <li>Library Weatherization - insulation opportunities are limited to Library attic spaces. Phase 1 for the roof deck was proposed.</li> <li>Bromfield Weatherization – mainly air sealing, door sweeps. – Included in the proposed application.</li> <li>Project i.ii.iii – issue PO or signed contract to ECI. Schedule Pre-Construction Meeting for week 9/20. Submit W-9.</li> <li>iv. TBS Court Lighting – replace with LED for energy and maintenance savings. Proposed. Note that the work has been completed. The project may be eligible for reimbursement with approval by DOER. – Brian to obtain actual date when payment was made by the School. Note that ECI suggested they could re-scope this project if not approved, to another lighting project such as TBS misc. non-LED remaining lighting.</li> <li>v. Future project – hybrid/EV police or fire admin vehicle.</li> <li>b. MassEnergize – this is a software tool for the Town to offer residents for greenhouse gas tracking. – The Climate group is working on a soft launch over the next few weeks.</li> <li>c. Annual Report – due 11/19. David working on update to energy use data.</li> </ol> </li> <li>Charging Station – HEAC is working with ECI to evaluate charging stations at five locations:         <ol> <li>a. HES – Station is on site waiting to be installed.</li> <li>b. Library – Input from Library Trustees – prefer location at end of parking lot away from building; may require new service; facilitates standard or fast charger.</li> <li>c. Bromfield – The spots recommended are in the back by the courts</li> </ol> </li> </ol>

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	which are closer to the electric panels for connecting the charger conductors. Some prefer to have it be in front and be more visible.  d. Town Hall – limited spots but supported by Town.  e. General Store – needs separate meter; issue with obstruction and limited space.  f. Other areas – Harvard Park (track); commercial district?  The MA state EVIP program should provide 100% of the funds required for the equipment and installation.  3. MRPC Regional Planning Assistance – Green Communities are eligible to have services that MRPC will apply for MA state DOER grants. The Town of Harvard signed the grant application 7/7/21 for the following (with \$ allocation).  a. The Green Community application and annual report service by MRPC is recommended to continue. (\$4500)  b. Developing a net-zero emissions plan for municipal buildings and operations (\$9000)  c. Preparation toward developing a community-wide net-zero plan (\$3500). These plans can support the Energy and Resiliency portions of the Climate Action Plan. – Grant not awarded yet.  4. All Boards Meeting – Brian to highlight top 3 goals (Climate Resolution, Net Zero Plan, Green Community Project completion, Green Community Grant Application including electric vehicles and chargers).  5. Vehicles – Possible vehicles to replace with electric – Ford Explorers (5), Dodge Chargers (2) F150 (1). Green Community may offer \$10-15k toward a replacement vehicle. Peter will be the point person for HEAC to work with Charles Oliver and others about vehicle replacements. Any Fire/Police electric vehicles will need chargers on site in advance. Charles Oliver suggested a pilot project for an electric or hybrid bus.
Subcommittees/ Initiatives	1. Energy Policy Subcommittee (Chair Paul Green)— Article supporting the MA greenhouse gas reduction goals (currently net zero by 2050) – Scheduled for Fall Town meeting. – The Select Board approved the Town Resolution on Climate Change at the 8/31 meeting. Paul, Ellen and Lucy Wallace are visiting all Town committees, developing a FAQ document, hosting public forums and creating public communications to get the word out.
Membership	The Select Board approved the change of Paul Green to Associate Member and Peter Kelly-Joseph to Member.
