Don called the meeting to order at 7:04PM.

**Minutes:** The Minutes of the November 15th meeting were unanimously approved.

Public Commentary: None.

#### **FY2018 Budget Reviews:**

- Spoke about the usual process

- Fire, Ambulance, Parks and Rec and Planning indicated for having further discussions
- Board of Health needs admin help.
  - Suggestion has been made to share 1/2 time employee between a few departments.
  - This is a position that exists, yet is unfilled.
- Paid employees taking minutes at meetings was discussed. FinCom agreed that it was a waste of employee time and should be done by volunteers on the various boards and committees.
- Questions for Departments due to Tim by December 16th.

#### **Town Administrator Report:**

- Discussed Massachusetts budget situation.
  - Governor has identified \$98 million in cuts to various earmarked programs.
  - Cherry sheet and local aid has been spared
- Town Clerk has been hired. Amy McDougal was recently the clerk in Shirley.
- BOS offered Finance Director position to a candidate among 3 finalists.
- DPW Director position has been posted. 6 or 7 applications have already been received.
- Free cash determination has been held up at the state level due to property tax certifications taking precedence.
- Budget is \$156,000 excess capacity for FY18.

## **Liaison Reports:**

- School Committee:
  - Budget YTD is \$20,000 in the red due to special education expenditures.

### - CPIC:

- Fire Ponds:
  - 5 Year fire pond repair has a \$250k estimate
  - Each pond needs \$600 study
  - CPIC asked to have 5 ponds repaired each year
- Town Records:
  - \$25k requested, but an additional \$125k needed
- Ambulance:
  - Ambulance and stretcher will be paid out of revenue from 911 calls.
  - Additional BOS meeting with UMass consultant will happen on December 19th.
- COA:
  - Newer van from MART has been assigned to COA
- Parks and Rec:
  - Stone wall on Mass Ave. around library isn't owned by town.
  - \$100k will come off of the CPIC request sheet and go to CPC for stone wall repair funding.
- Schools
  - \$150k for Bromfield MS ramp split into \$30k for study and design, \$120k for construction
- Capital projects will overwhelm capital fund by FY2022
  - Alternative funding mechanisms for capital projects must be identified

#### **Other Business:**

- Old Library Survey
  - Property survey will cost \$3200
  - Reserve fund transfer approved for cost unanimously
- Old Library Scheme 3
  - \$9700 requested for architectural plans
  - FinCom voted to deny request unanimously
    - Request was deemed to be premature because the various options have not been agreed to or approved by the Town or BOS.

Efforts are underway on several projects to improve the cost estimates. While no proposal has been \* This snaphot highlights the large project proposals which Town may face in coming years to be funded by new debt. The costs shown are rough received for a new water source, it is listed as this is being closely monitored. The planning of these large projects requires further refinement as we seek to balance a project's impact on the town's debt and the urgency to address the needs of Town's building and infrastructure needs.

This schedule does not include current town debt from prior projects, including: the School Roof Repairs (retiring 2017), Public Safety Building (retiring 2021), Bromfield School (retiring 2025), various fire trucks, Town Hall Renovations soon to be bonded, and Hildreth House Accessibility project that is expected to be built this year.
